In prelude to the much anticipated opening of *La Reine-garçon* on January 31, pianist/composer Adam Sherkin returns to the Free Concert Series stage in a virtuosic program showcasing the keyboard music of opera composer, Julien Bilodeau. This performance includes a world premiere: "Three Paraphrases on *La Reine-garçon,*" written especially for Sherkin. From Bilodeau: "Through these three paraphrases, the listener will be transported on a condensed journey that recounts the highlights of the opera while being able to appreciate a mode of pianistic writing that is both virtuoso and poetic."

#### **Anthony Ratinov - piano**

Hailed for his "unwavering energy and precision" (*La Scena Musicale*), American pianist Anthony Ratinov captivates audiences worldwide, commanding the stage with "class, style, technical mastery, and solo prowess" (*Beckmesser*).

Ratinov won Third Prize at this year's prestigious Concours musical international de Montréal piano competition, where he was praised for his "striking confidence in taking risks" and ability to "go beyond the virtuoso challenge and have fun with the music" (*Le Devoir*). Ratinov also won Second Prize at last year's Busoni International Piano Competition with his performance of Prokofiev's Third Piano Concerto, lauded for "sporting a pianism at the highest level... with admirable dexterity and stainless precision" (*L'Ape Musicale*). Some additional honours include First Prize at the 2023 Ricard Viñes International Piano Competition, Second Prize and Audience Favourite Prize at the 2023 València Iturbi International Piano Competition, and Second Prize at the 2022 Olga Kern International Piano Competition.

Ratinov began his musical journey at the age of four under the tutelage of his grandmother, Edit Ratinova, who taught at the renowned Gnessin Music School in Moscow for 45 years and was a student of the school's founder, Elena Fabianovna

Gnesina. Ratinov is currently pursuing an Artist Diploma at The Juilliard School in the studio of Robert McDonald. He completed his graduate studies at the Yale School of Music studying with Boris Berman and Boris Slutsky, and previously studied at Yale University, where he majored in chemical engineering and graduated with honours, in addition to studying piano with Wei-Yi Yang.

Ratinov has appeared as a soloist with orchestras across Europe and North America, including a recent soldout performance of Chopin's F minor Piano Concerto at Barcelona's iconic Palau de la Música Catalana. His solo concert tours have spanned the Netherlands, Spain, Italy, and the U.S., with appearances at renowned venues such as The Royal Concertgebouw in Amsterdam, ORF RadioKulturhaus in Vienna, and The Kennedy Center in Washington.

A celebrated and sought-after chamber musician, he has also won several prestigious chamber music competitions with the piano trio, Trio Ondata, including First Prize and Audience Favourite Prize at the 2023 Chamber Music in Yellow Springs Competition, and the Silver Medal at the 2022 Fischoff Chamber Music Competition. Ratinov regularly participates in music festivals throughout the year, including appearances at the Four Seasons Chamber Music Festival, the Taos School of Music, and the Bowdoin International Music Festival. His debut CD, featuring works by Albéniz, Scriabin, Chopin, and Bach, is set for release this year under KNS Classical.

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
